This Timely Warning is being issued in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Act and the purpose is to provide preventative information to the campus community to aid members from becoming the victim of a similar crime.

REPORTED CRIME: The Sonoma State Police Department is investigating an arson that took place in the Physical Education Building restroom near the men's locker room between the hours of 5 p.m. Friday, May 23, 2025, and 4 a.m. Tuesday, May 27, 2025. Minor damage was caused.

There is no suspect information at this time.
