RE: Suspected explosive device (Case #SS26-20)

The Sonoma State University Police Department is seeking community assistance with information about a suspected explosive device that was discovered at 5:45 p.m. today at the northwest section of the Lakes.

Officers were alerted to the suspected device by a community member who was magnet fishing at the Lakes. The community member contacted the University Police Department, which immediately isolated the area and began an investigation.

Based on an officer's observations, the Sonoma County Sheriff's Department bomb squad was called to assist. A bomb squad detective collected the device to render it safe at an off-campus facility.

At no time was the community in imminent danger.
